CLAY CHRISTENSEN THE INNOVATOR'S DILEMMA

"IS ABOUT THE FAILURE OF COMPANIES TO STAY ATOP THEIR INDUSTRIES WHEN THEY CONFRONT CERTAIN TYPES OF MARKETS AND TECHNOLOGICAL CHANGE. IT'S NOT ABOUT THE FAILURE OF SIMPLY ANY COMPANY, BUT OF GOOD COMPANIES - THE KINDS THAT MANY MANAGERS HAVE ADMIRED AND TRIED TO EMULATE, THE COMPANIES KNOWN FOR THEIR ABILITIES TO INNOVATE AND EXECUTE...IT IS ABOUT WELL-MANAGED COMPANIES THAT HAVE THEIR COMPETITIVE ANTENNAE UP, LISTEN ASTUTELY TO THEIR CUSTOMERS, INVEST AGGRESSIVELY IN NEW TECHNOLOGIES, AND YET STILL LOSE MARKET DOMINANCE."

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

- A. STARTUP: A COMPANY IN THE EARLY STAGES OF
 DETERMINING PRODUCT-MARKET FIT, EXPERIMENTING
 WITH CUSTOMER SEGMENTATION AND WORKING
 TOWARD A POSITIVE CONTRIBUTION MARGIN.
- B. SCALE-UP: A COMPANY THAT HAS ALREADY
 VALIDATED ITS PRODUCT WITHIN THE MARKETPLACE
 AND HAS PROVEN THAT THE UNIT ECONOMICS ARE
 SUSTAINABLE.



1871 INNOVATION CENTER CHICAGO

- CHICAGO WAS FACING SIMILAR ISSUES AS SOUTH FLORIDA
- HAD THE TECHNOLOGY INFRASTRUCTURE, BUT NOT COHESIVE
- IN 2012, PRITZKER DONATED 50,000 SQUARE FEET IN THE MERCHANDISE MARKET TO SUPPORT CHICAGO'S DIGITAL STARTUP COMMUNITY
- MERCHANDISE MART WAS 4 MILLION SQUARE FEET AND STRUGGLING
- NOW, THE 1871 INNOVATION CENTER IS UP TO 200,000 SQUARE FEET AND THE MERCHANDISE MART IS BASICALLY FULLY OCCUPIED. HOME TO 500 EARLY STAGE, HIGH GROWTH DIGITAL STARTUPS FROM AROUND THE COUNTRY
- FORTUNE 500 COMPANIES FLOCKED TO THE MERCHANDISE MART TO LOCATE THEIR SKUNKWORK OPERATIONS AND INNOVATION CENTERS
- CHICAGO IS NOW FLOURISHING AS A TECHNOLOGY AND INNOVATION HUB
